ZAKIR HUSAIN DELHI COLLEGE

A BRIEF HISTORY

Zakir Husain Delhi College, one of the oldest and most prestigious colleges in Delhi, comes with the legacy of a rich and a historically significant past. The institution traces its origins back to a Madrasa, founded by Ghaziuddin Firoz Jung that went on to become one of Delhi's leading places of learning.

Until the late eighteenth century, the Madrasa was located near a Mosque just outside Ajmeri Gate, one of the gates of the walled city of Shahjahanabad. Built in the Indo-Saracenic style, the old building was designed with all the elements of a Madrasa-Mosque, Maktaba, a library and a double tier of Hujras for the students. The Madrasa, at that time, functioned as a traditional Muslim institution of higher learning with Arabic and Persian being taught to a small number of students.

The British took over Delhi in 1803, and this humble abode of learning became Delhi College, also popularly known as 'Dilli College' in 1825. The institution remained one of the centres of the Delhi Renaissance during 1830-40s. It was closed down after the War of Independence in 1857, only to open two decades later in 1877, when it was merged with the Government College of Lahore.

Initially, Arabic and Persian were the main languages taught at the Madrasa. However, with the establishment of British rule across the country, there was an increasing desire for teaching-learning of English. The College, however, retained Urdu as medium of studies with special emphasis on Arabic, Persian and Sanskrit. One of the salient features of Delhi College was that modern subjects like Mathematics, Geometry, Philosophy, and Physics, amongst other sciences were taught in Urdu. The college set up the Delhi Vernacular Society in 1832 for the translation of scientific treatises, Greek classics and Persian works into Urdu. The teachers and the students

became the centre of a scientific and literary flowering that C.F. Andrew's referred to as 'the Delhi Renaissance.'

The old Delhi College progressed with Oriental and Western education, a step to uphold secularization and modernization because its purpose was to provide both traditional and modern knowledge to the students. With the advancement of science, the College was able to create an atmosphere of rationality to challenge shackles of conservatism. As has been said by Sir Syed Ahmed Khan "We should have philosophy in our right hand, Natural Science in the left and the crown of 'Kalma-e-Tayyaba' on our head".

The partition of India, in 1947, led to the brief closure of the College. But the strenuous efforts of Mirza Mehmood Begg, a thorough philanthropist and a visionary in the field of education, led to the revival of Delhi College. With the cooperation of a few old and new members of the faculty and patrons, he instilled a new lease of life in the College. Begg's position as the Principal of the college ensured a modest beginning in 1947 with 200-250 students which later flowered into a fully-fledged institution accommodating more than a thousand students. It was under his stewardship that evening classes were started in 1958 to enable employed youth to continue their education. Thus, the Evening College catered to a wide variety and a relatively bigger number of students. In the mid 1970s, the college suffered from an absolute cash crunch and financial crisis, and was subsequently handed over to the Zakir Husain Memorial Trust. The new name of the college was **Zakir** Husain College in 1975.

The Evening College began with a course called Preparatory Class. It received a grant from the UGC in 1969 and, thereafter, new rooms were constructed for Vice-Principal, the Bursar and a separate library for the students. The infrastructure of the College improved in the subsequent years under the able guidance of the former Principals-Mr. Manzoor Husain Musavi, Dr. Mohit Kumar Haldar, Dr. Syed Ahmad Ali, Mr. Salman Ghani Hashmi, Mr. Roop Lal Sharma, Mr. Mohd Riaz Umar, Dr. S.A. Hamideen, Dr. M.N. Sitaraman and Dr. Shankar Lal. As a recent development, air conditioners were installed in the college office, staff-room and in the library. The facility of networking and internet was made available to the teachers as well as the students. Today, the College has a modern computer lab. Computers have also been provided in the library. Compactors have been installed in the library to create more space and to keep books free from dust.

The college has maintained its sustained trajectory of development under the leadership of the Principal, Dr. M.A. Beg who joined the College in 2015. The infrastructure of the college has greatly improved. With more CCTV cameras at various spots, vigorous patrolling by an increased number of security personnel and a vigilant Proctorial Board, student discipline has seen a tremendous improvement. Classrooms are well lit, and equipped with LCD projectors. The elevators have been made functional for the Evening College. LCD screens in the staffroom and outside the Academic Block ensure that the college fraternity is informed of important circulars and notices, including schedule of classes and teachers on leave. The college building is being refurbished. A new committee room has been set up. The college has a computer centre with more than one hundred computers in the library for the use of students. With the cooperation and guidance of the Principal, various departments organised seminars, conferences and workshops over the last year. The Mirza Mehmood Begg Memorial Lecture, in memory of the legendary founder Principal of the college from 1947-1964, was organised in 2016, 2017 and 2018, and will remain an annual feature. Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening) therefore maintains an amicable blend between the old and the new – we have moved forward keeping in tune with the times, and yet, the college makes every effort to uphold the values that characterised Delhi College in the 19th century. It continues to maintain the “Ganga Jamuna Tehzeeb” that characterised the college. The College steadfastly practices the ideals of secularism and tolerance, gender and social equality. The teachers and students come from different backgrounds and communities, and bonding in the face of this diversity is quintessential to the values of the college. Students learn to uphold these cultural values and yet be open to new ideas.

Strengths

Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening) is a premier and one of the most renowned institutions of the University of Delhi. The college is not only meticulous in applying creative pedagogical methods but it also retains the ethics and values rooted in its heritage. The teaching and non-teaching staff work in cooperation and harmony with each other to provide an amiable and cordial atmosphere. Apart from a deep knowledge of their respective subjects, students are taught to be disciplined, benevolent, and above all, humanitarian. One of the main objectives of the college, therefore, along with imparting knowledge, is that of building its students' character.

It is centrally located, symbolically at the threshold of the old city and the new. The premises of the College are enriched with plush lawns, trees, plants and shrubs and herbs.

It has been fortunate in having a distinguished, a highly qualified, dynamic faculty that is actively involved in academic and research activities, both within the college and also at the University level. Many of our teachers have been actively involved in designing pedagogy, curriculum, conducting research activities, guiding students, and conducting workshops, seminars and conference both at national and international level. They have been members in nationally and internationally acclaimed bodies.

The college offers Honours courses in English, Hindi, History, Persian, Political Science, Sanskrit, Urdu and Commerce at UG level and Hindi, Philosophy, Political Science at PG level. The annually published College prospectus gives all relevant and updated information to admission seekers as well as their guardians. There is a methodical admission procedure as per University prescribed guidelines that ensures that admissions are conducted smoothly. A team of able counsellors guide each student through the various stages of admission.

Each year, the new session begins with an Orientation Programme addressed by the Principal of the college, outlining the guidelines, college rules and regulations and basic values along with an acknowledgement of the previous year's academic achievements. The students are introduced to faculty members who head various Committees and whom they can approach in any eventuality. The College website [www.http://zakirhusainpgeve.in](http://zakirhusainpgeve.in) helps the students in checking attendance and evaluation records.

The college has a well-stocked library with a rich collection of books, journals, magazines and newspapers. The e-resource centre is equipped with a number of network computers where one can access e-books, e-journals, and a number of e-data bases.

The college **Auditorium, Seminar Room and Audio-Visual room** have state of art acoustics and overhead projection facilities, the college has ample room for extracurricular activities, conferences, educational film shows and lectures. The college also has a Computer Centre and is connected to University of Delhi by WAN.

The college has set up the **Career Counselling and Placement Cell** for proper guidance and recruitment facilities on campus. A special cell is available in the College for students from the North-East to prevent racial discrimination and harassment.

The **sports facilities** in the college are at par with University standards. We have separately maintained courts and grounds for sport activities like cricket, basket ball, volley ball, and football. There are also indoor spaces for Chess, Carom, Judo, and Table Tennis.

The college **canteen** is a students' hub, where hygienically prepared varieties of Indian meals are served. There is also a 'Mother Dairy' and a 'Safal' outlet for healthy drinks and juices. **Ours is one of the first Colleges across University of Delhi to declare its campus a 'Smoke free zone'.**

The college provides **medical facilities** for all teaching and non-teaching staff and students. Doctors are available at designated timings. Health check up camps and blood donation camps are conducted regularly by the college NSS unit.

The students are encouraged to develop and contribute to all forms of life, including the political. **The Student's Union** is an elected body that fosters intellectual, political and cultural enhancement among the students. Alongside making the students politically and socially aware of their environment the students' union hones their creative abilities and stages students' talent in its **Annual fest, Zeenat.**

Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening) is the first college in University of Delhi to **publish five different magazines in four languages – Bengali, English, Hindi, Urdu, and Commerce.** Giving the students opportunities to perform at different levels, there are fourteen departments and each has its own academic society that organises seminars, conferences debates, talks, field trips etc. NCC and NSS units offer students opportunities to associate themselves with rudiments of military services and social services.

A well-rounded student is one who participates equally in academic as well as extra curricular activities. The college has a number of vibrant and active cultural societies including the **Arts and Culture, Bazm-e-Adab, Debating, Film and Photography Societies** which engage students with their socio-cultural milieu where they can hone their skills and earn laurels for

themselves and the institution. The students thoroughly enjoy and participate in the programmes of these Societies.

The Proctorial Board, Anti-Ragging and Internal Complaint Committees ensure discipline and security of the students and facilitate the maintenance of a safe and secure environment in the college congenial for education. CCTV cameras are installed at different spots throughout the college to ensure safety and security and maintain discipline. Safety of women and our girl students is of paramount importance and the Committee against Sexual Harassment works towards enhancing efforts towards gender sensitization and awareness.

The college also provides **financial assistance and scholarship** to the needy students such as Wakf Council scholarship, H.H. Zuberi Aid fund and R.Venkateshan Aid Fund. Monetary award such as Nidhi Devgan Memorial, Shyama Saxena, Arunabh Borgohain Memorial Awards are given to the deserving candidates.

The fourth Mirza Mehmood Begg memorial lecture was delivered in the auditorium of Zakir Husain Delhi College Evening on the 18th April, 2019. In keeping with the practice for the last four years, Prof. Bidyut Chakrabarty, who is not only the Vice-Chancellor of Vishwa Bharti University, West Bengal, but also an eminent personality in the field for Political Science, was invited to address a gathering of students and teachers. The topic of the lecture delivered by Prof. Bidyut Chakrabarty was "How To View Gandhi?". Apart from the lecture being very eclectic and extremely interesting in its own right, the very act of remembering Gandhi, his contributions and his personality was a pleasant relief from the politically charged environment of Delhi this month. In his lecture, Prof. Chakrabarty, tried to look into the personal, social, ethico-moral and political reasons that made Gandhi the transcendental figure that he was. ARMY ATTACHMENT CAMP : In this camp, the cadets are trained by the instructors of a particular regiment, in military tactics including day/night warfare & also get familiar with the weaponry. Our 30 cadets attended the army attachment camp held in Meerut Cantt. And trained under the guidance and supervision of JCOs of the 274 field regiment (artillery). The ZHDC platoon of 30 cadets was led by JUO Ubais and SUO Raju As 7DBN senior and college senior respectively.

ADVANCED LEADERSHIP CAMP: Advanced leadership camps are conducted twice every year, which many cadets from all over the country attend to learn leadership skills, focus on personality development and orientation for induction into the armed forces.

This year three of our cadets were selected to attend the advanced leadership camps.

ALC-II Coimbatore: JUO Himanshu Khewaria attended the camp representing the Delhi directorate was one of the four cadets selected from the Delhi directorate.

ALC-III Ahmedabad: SUO Munish Rana and JUO Deepak were selected to attend the ALC-III. Out of the four cadets selected, two of them were from our college. SUO Munish Rana was directorate senior 2IC, (Delhi Directorate) and also bagged the All India 2nd Rank in the mock SSB tests conducted throughout the camp.

AMAR JAWAN JYOTI : Six cadets from our college and most of them the first year cadets were selected for amarjawanjyoti celebration for different events like guard of honor to the amarjawan and wreath laying ceremony out of which nine were the part of the quarter guard and six of them were in the wreath laying ceremony. SUO Munish Rana was selected as the ALL INDIA GUARD COMMANDER.

Combined Annual Training Camps (CATC)

In C.A.T.C., the boys (Senior & Junior Division) and girl cadets (Senior & Junior Wing) of a particular NCC unit participate in the 15-day camp. Classes are conducted as per the given syllabus wherein certain aspects of NCC training are taught once again. The camp acts as a refresher training for the cadets and they are also trained in basic skills of survival and emergencies besides other topics. They are taught certain skills pertaining specifically to their

Wing. Another activity in the camp is the "dogwatch" wherein two cadets are to stay on sentry duty for two hours at any time given time of the day. Those caught sleeping, especially during late night or early morning shifts, or otherwise missing from duty are severely reprimanded or penalized. Cadets are also introduced to weapons such as a .22 caliber rifle.

Our 75 cadets attended the camp led by SUO Munish Rana And SUO Rju Kumar Singh.

National Integration Camp (NIC): NIC is to propagate national integration among cadets and the society. Only the best cadets in drills and march are sent to represent their states. These camps are conducted on All India basis and help bridge the cultural gap among various States of India. In this camp cadets are tough and have high leadership quality and are stage daring.

This session witnessed our cadets participating in several NICs held in various parts of the country. Our cadets utilized the opportunity to gel with the cadets of other directorates and to share cultures to bring a feeling of oneness among themselves. Only three cadets were selected from Delhi Directorate and all three of them were from our college. Cadet Rajat Kumar led the Delhi Directorate contingent in the camp.

ThalSainik Camp (TSC): The TSC is a 12 days camp conducted in Delhi every year in the late autumn, in which the cadets are selected from all 17 directorates (30+3 cadets from each directorate), by the selection procedure conducting 3 pre-TSC camps each of 10–12 days in a week interval. Report of the Students' Union 2018-19

Reports of the Activities of Various Societies of Departments

We present below a brief account of some of the activities organized by various departments in the last academic year.

Department of English Report

English Literary Society Report 2018-19

The English Literary Society has organised several events in this academic session of 2018-19. The first event was a seminar on 25th September, 2018 on Indian Poetics by Prof C. Upendra

Rao, an expert of Sanskrit and Pali from School of Sanskrit and Indic Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University. He spoke on the topic “Rasa and its application on Sanskrit Dramas in light of Natyashastra”. Students and teachers participated in it and Prof Upendra Rao’s in depth knowledge of the subject and his lucid expression of the same benefitted each and every body who heard his lecture. The next event was a lecture by Dr Rudrashish Chakrabarty, an Assistant Professor from Kirorimal College, University of Delhi who spoke on “Literary Criticism over the Ages”. This talk was organised on 5th of October, 2018. On 2nd November, 2018 another lecture was held on Indian Diaspora named “Literatures of Diaspora”. Prof Harish Narang from the Centre for English studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University spoke on diaspora in general and on literature written around diaspora.

The ELS of our college along with ELS of Zakir Husain Delhi College (Morning) jointly organised an International students’ seminar on 27th of February, 2019 on “Myths and Archetypes and their Workings in Drama”. Two distinguished guests Kira Obolonsky and Michelle Hensley had addressed the audience in the plenary session. Students across Delhi’s colleges and universities read papers which were selected for the Seminar.

On 11th and 12th March, 2019, the annual literary fest named Zaklit was held. It had multiple Inter-college competitions like literary quiz, literary enactment, creative writing, poetry competition, film review competition, photography, street theatre and so on. Around 30 colleges from across Delhi participated in the events. The events started off with a key note address by Prof Sukrita Paul Kumar a renowned scholar, poet and folklorist. She spoke on text and performance. The ELS convener Al Moohshina Muzzammil, the core students’ team of Naveen Kumar, Diksha Rathore, Urooj Khan, Garima Tyagi, Harshita Singh and Houreipou; the TIC, Dr Sanjib Kr Baishya, along with the teaching faculty of our the Department of English worked hard to put up the aforementioned programmes throughout the year.

The Department of English, Zakir Husain Delhi College [Evening] organized a National conference on [Re] Defining Marginalities on 16th March, 2019. Eminent scholars, academicians and students from major universities and institutions in India participated in the conference, making it a successful endeavour.

The conference sought to address how the definition of Marginality in contemporary times. Prejudice, neglect and exclusion are defining aspects of what it means to be marginal, but defining marginality and pinpointing its role in our lives remains a difficult task. The

Department of English, Zakir Husain Delhi College [Evening] took up the challenge and helped to provide a pulpit for the articulations of scholars and academic stalwarts alike.

The organizing committee consisted of the Principal of Zakir Husain Delhi college [Evening] who was also the Conference patron Dr. Masroor Ahmed Beg, Convenor Dr.Sanjib Kumar Baishya, Co Convenor Dr. Anas Tabraiz, Organizing secretary Dr. Madhumita Chakraborty and Treasurer Dr.Hari Prasad. Our editorial team worked laboriously to come up with a concept note that attracted 60+ entries and after continuous revision and editing we arrived at it. The main members were Ms. Poulomi Bose, Dr.Simi Rizvi, Ms.Nahid Sana Khan, Mr.Vikas Jain and Ms. Tina Das. Other members included Ms Poonam Kaul, Dr.Tejaswini Deo, Ms.Al Moohshina Muzammil, Ms.Yashika Munjal.

The conference began with the Keynote address by Dr. Raj Kumar who provided a cogent overview of the topic and firmly set it's historical and theoretical contexts. He suggested new approaches and directions to the theme. The topic garnered a multitude of response from more than ten universities and students from various states presented their papers.

The eclectic mix of papers compelled the editorial team to categorize them into various sessions like– ‘The Grotesque Body Disabilities and Disfigurements’ chaired by Someshwar Sati , ‘Media Narratives’ chaired by Vinod Verma , ‘Renegotiating The Marginal’ chaired by Milindh Awadh, ‘Narratives of Confinement’ chaired by Anas Tabraiz, ‘Gendered Spaces’ chaired by Payal Nagpal, ‘Literatures of the Diaspora’ chaired by Prem Kumari Srivastava, ‘Marginal Spaces in the Indian Context’ chaired by Praveen Priyadarshi, ‘Socio Political Resistances’ chaired by Debjani Sengupta, ‘Folklores and Myth’ chaired by Walunir, ‘The Grotesque Body: Disabilities and Disfigurements 2’ chaired by Roomy Naqvy.

These sessions were held parallel in clusters of two. The day culminated with a fruitful exchange of research, ideas, and ideologies across topics ranging from discussions on disabled children in cinema, drug addiction and war veterans in ‘The Midnight Line’, to Prison writings of Bengal among others.

The Valedictory session included a speech by Dr.A.Bimol Akoijam from the centre for the Study of Social Systems , JNU. He discussed how civilization is at war with culture, and the diversion of labour , increase in empirical knowledge, complex machinery of modern state has facilitated a

rigorous distinction between classes which have all conspired to divide humanity, hence there is a need for understanding and launching new inquiries into the term marginality which has acquired a diversity of meanings.

Department of Mathematics Society

Anjuman-e-Farsi of Zakir Husain Delhi College Evening organized an extension lecture on the topic “Persian Literature in India” on 5th March 2019 at 4 PM. Prof. Sharif Husain Qasemi, Former Head, Department of Persian was invited to deliver the lecture. The lecture was presided over by Prof. Aleem Ashraf Khan, Head, Department of Persian and Prof. Rajinder Kumar was Guest of Honor of this program. The president of Anjuman-e-Farsi, Dr. Mehmood Fayyaz introduced the speaker and welcomed the guests with a flower of bouquet. Prof. Qasemi talked in detail on the importance of Persian Language and Literature in India with special reference to the styles of poetry of poets of India and Iran like Nizami Ganjavi, Amir Khusraw, Hasan Sijzi, Urfi Shirazi, Faizi, Zuhuri, Hafiz, Bedil, Iqbal and Ghalib. Prof. Qasemi specially emphasized on this

that ‘if the women of India had learnt Persian language then this language would be a common language’. After the lecture Prof. Aleem Ashraf Khan in his presidential speech said that the first dictionary of Persian compiled in India only and excellent works on epistolography also came into existence here and India enjoys its mastery on these. Department of Political Science Society

This year (2018-19) *Pratibimb*, the Political Science society of the Department of Political Science, Zakir Husain Delhi College Evening organized two sets of events with the objective of students’ academic engagement. On 25th -26th October, 2018 we organized a two day workshop in collaboration with **Centre for Law and Policy Research** and **The Praja Foundation, Delhi** in the college premises. The themes of the workshop were The Indian Constitution on the day one, and Urban Governance in India on the day two. On 8th March 2019, the society organized *Siyasat 19* which included three competitions were organized.

The workshop on “Understanding Indian Constitution” was divided into two parts. The first part of the workshop focused on the idea of ‘constitutional culture’ and the role of the constituent assembly debates in understanding our constitutional culture. In the second part, the students learnt to use internet tools to search the constituent assembly debates.

The resource team led by Disha Choudhary and Vineeth, from the Centre for Law and Policy Research engaged students with the tool of worksheets containing questions. The students were provided online assistance to employ internet search techniques to access information. The article 48 of the Indian constitution was used as a reference to understand different points of views raised in course of the constituent assembly debate on the issue of “Cow Slaughter”. Students demonstrated a keen sense of participation and enthusiastically engaged in the proceedings.

On the second day (26th October 2018), the theme of the workshop revolved around “Understanding Urban Governance in India”. Pallavi Kakaji from Praja Foundation was the lead resource person for the day. The programme began with providing students with an overall architecture of urban governance in the Indian cities. Pallavi Kakaji highlighted the ethics and probity related to urban governance in Delhi. She also elaborated upon the dichotomous web of politics and bureaucracy in Delhi as a reason for problems occurring at local urban governance in Delhi (MCD,NDMC). She opinionated that citizens’ participation through various information technology mechanisms could accelerate the accountability of the elected representative in Delhi. Post exploration towards the theme, students healthily participated in discussion and thought a provoking deliberation ensued.

The workshop endeavored to make students aware and encourage them to reflect and adapt to the changing demands of social science research through the engagements of evolving research tools.

The programme was conducted with full support and guidance from Dr M.Tariq Sayeed (Teacher in charge). Apart from that, all faculty members of the department contributed positively to the successful organization of the event. The successful culmination of the two-day workshop was possible due to the hard work and full participation of the student organizing team of *Pratibimb* led by Anshul Gautam, the president of the society.

Siyasat 2019, a commendable initiative by members of the political science society and students of the department was organized on 8th March, 2019 in the college. The events were solely a creation and design of students to enhance their competitive aptitude through intra- college poetry (Kavya Manjari), extempore (Majlis) and quiz competitions. The event witnessed great deal of enthusiasm with a healthy participation of students from across departments.
