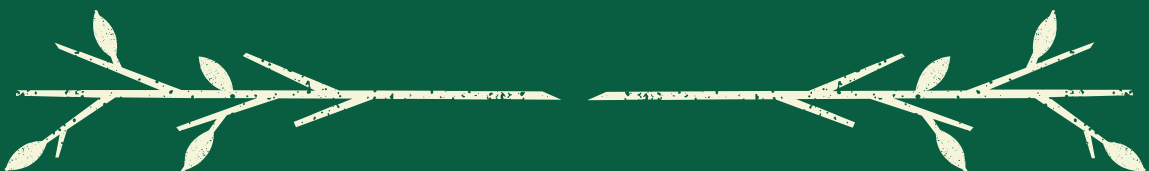

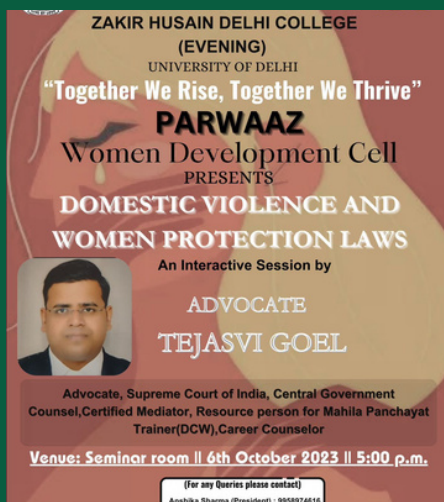

WEBINAR: DR. JUHI GUPTA



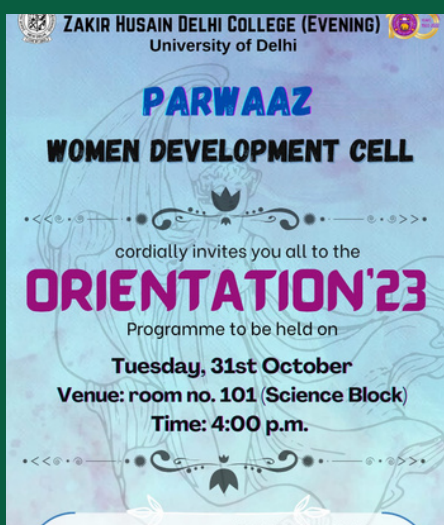

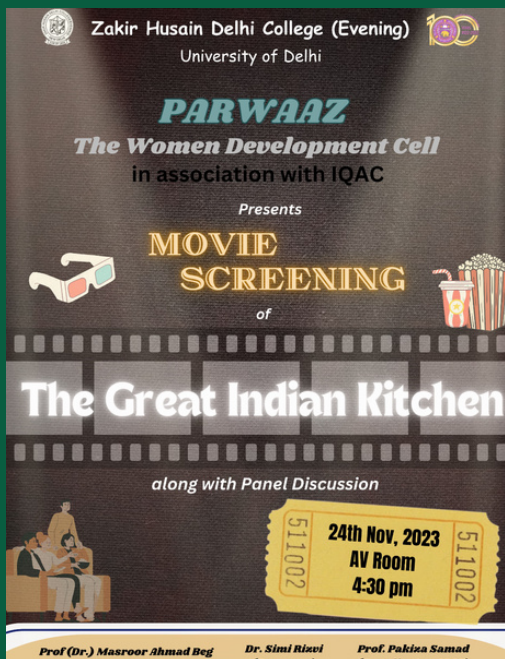
ORIENTATION : STUDENT'S INDUCTION

MOVIE - SCREENING

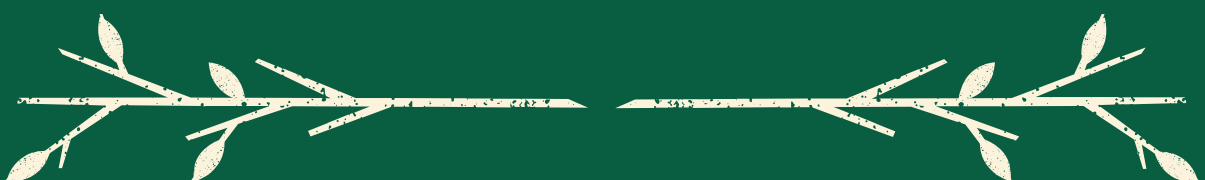

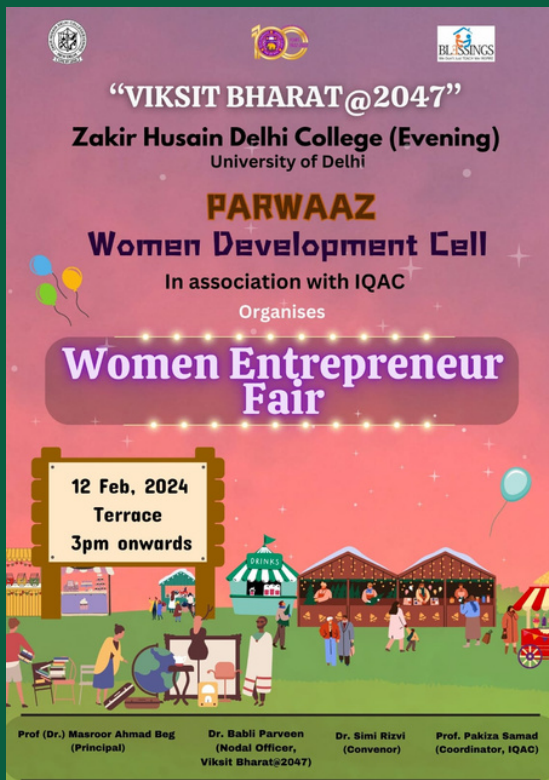

WOMEN'S ENTREPRENEUR FAIR

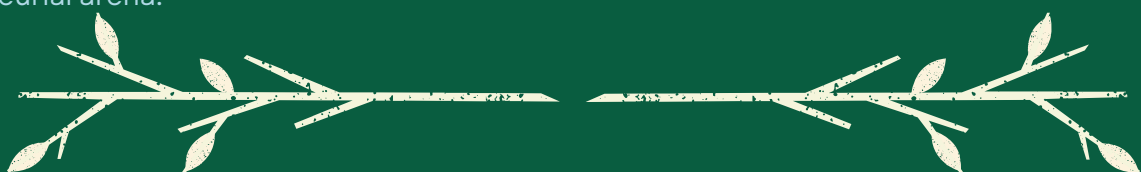

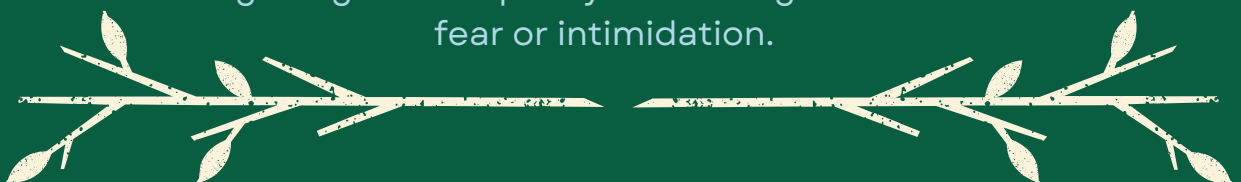
SELF DEFENCE WORKSHOP


