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## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



Dear Applicant,

I welcome you as a prospective member of Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening) fraternity. With its humble beginnings in an 18th century Madrasa, it is the oldest college of Delhi, having witnessed a lot of contemporary Indian history. The college was formally affiliated to Delhi University in 1924. The Evening College started in 1958. The college was renamed after the former President of India, Dr. Zakir Husain in 1975 and shifted to its present location in the early 1990's. In order to maintain the link between the illustrious history of the college and its present, the college Trust unanimously resolved to rename the college as Zakir Husain Delhi College in July 2010. With such a long and illustrious history, the college also has a long list of distinguished alumni, with the likes of Mirza Ghalib, Bhism Sahani, Ravi Chaturvedi, Tejinder Sharma (MBE) among the list of students who have passed through the portals of this college.

Today, Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening) has an impressive campus with infrastructure to match other constituent colleges of the University of Delhi. A new nine-storey building is now almost ready, with more spacious classrooms, amphitheatre, courts and playgrounds. It should be inaugurated any time in the near future.

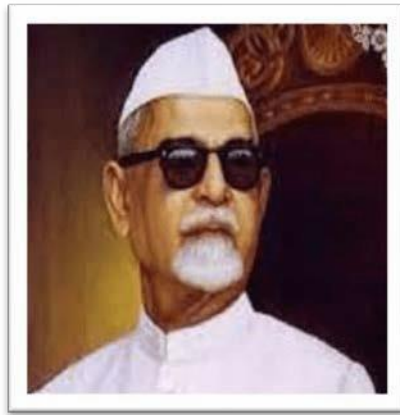
The college has 14 departments, which offer courses in various undergraduate disciplines. Students come to us from every nook and corner of the country, after having qualified the CUET exam and having chosen the college among their choices. The college aims to provide a 360 degree holistic education to all students. This wide variety of students adds tremendous value both inside and outside the classroom, as students learn, not just from their teachers, but also their peers. The college has professionally qualified and academically devoted teachers, who have made a name for themselves nationally and internationally. Through their presence in various committees and societies which organize co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, they play a crucial role in grooming the personality of our students. Each department has its departmental society, which organizes talks and other events. Our students have excelled, not only in academics, but also in sports, arts and culture and in several other fields. Each student is assigned a teacher who acts as a mentor/counsellor. They are encouraged to share her/his concerns – academic or non-academic, with the mentor. Ours is an equal-opportunities College that promises gender

equality. The Internal Complaints Committee acts swiftly and impartially on any complaint received. We have zero tolerance for ragging and sexual harassment. Closed Circuit TVs are installed at several places in the college premises to ensure overall safety and security. The North East cell has been specially set up for our students from the region, with a teacher mentor for the same. The Placement Committee works towards organizing various camps for the students to enable them to find suitable employment. Committees like Film and Photography Society, Debating Society, Arts and Culture Society among others enable students to develop their co-curricular skills. We have a vibrant Eco Club that sensitizes students towards the need to preserve the environment. The college offers scholarships and financial assistance on the basis of merit and need, to students from disadvantaged categories. Eligible students need to submit the required documents when asked to do so by the authorities, and each case will be considered by the Committee.

All admitted students are required to attend an Orientation before the commencement of regular classes. This programme provides an audio-visual insight into the functioning of the college to make the ‘freshers’ feel at home in their new environment. All admitted students should follow the college website regularly for details of the programme and also for all important notices and information regarding the college. **Dr. Zakir Husain**

**1897 – 1969**

Dr. Zakir Husain, after whom this college is named was the President of India from 1967-1969. He obtained M.A. from Aligarh Muslim University, and did his Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Berlin.

At the young age of 23, Dr. Zakir Husain, as a leader of a young group of students, founded the National Muslim University in Aligarh in 1920, which later shifted its base to Jamia Nagar in Delhi, now named Jamia Millia Islamia.

The chief motive of Dr. Zakir Husain was to use education as the chief tool to help India during the period of freedom struggle against the British. He remained the Vice Chancellor of Jamia Millia Islamia for 22 years in 1948; he was appointed the Vice Chancellor of Aligarh Muslim University.

Dr. Zakir Husain chaired the committee to formulate the scheme of basic education following the Wardha Educational Conference in 1937.

An educator and intellectual, Dr. Zakir Husain served as the Governor of Bihar, Vice President of India and later as the President of India. He was awarded Bharat Ratna, India's highest national honour, in 1963.



## HERITAGE, PAST AND RECENT

Zakir Husain Delhi College can justly claim to be the oldest college in Delhi. The origin of college dates to 1780 when Ghaziuddin Khan established a madrasa near a mosque outside Shahjahan Abad's Ajmeri Darwaja (Gate). Gradually, by 1825, this humble abode of learning had developed into Delhi College, popularly known ever since as 'Dilli College'. Called variously as Ghazi-ud- Din Madrasa, or Anglo-Arabic School, or Delhi College, or Zakir Husain College, the building served both as a school and a college.



This building was one of the centers of the Delhi Renaissance during the 1830s-1840s. However, by the middle of 19th century due to political turmoil and the Great Uprising of 1857, it was shut down. When reopened, its location was Kashmiri Gate. In 1877, Delhi College was merged with the Government College of Lahore by which time it had returned to its original moorings at Ajmeri Gate.



Built in the Indo-Saracenic style, this complex is architecturally rich in design having all the desired elements and components of a madrasa that is, a mosque, maktab (elementary school), a library and a double-tier of hujras (accommodation) for the students. It is a rare specimen of the traditional Mughal School which has been used in many ways but the cardinal use has always been educational.

The partition of the country in 1947 jolted the college. But after the temporary closure, the institution arose phoenix-like from its ashes, due to the remarkable efforts of Mirza Mahmood Begg, a philanthropist in the field of education. His dedication to the revival of Delhi College, with the co-operation of old and new faculty, and patrons, led to a new phase in the history of this college. From the modest beginning in 1947 with 200 students, the number of students swelled to 1000 in a short time, drawn by the new disciplines taught. Such was its reputation that under Begg Sahib's stewardship an idea to hold evening classes was mooted – to enable employed youth to continue their higher studies. Thus, was born Delhi College (Evening) in 1958. Soon, it began to cater to a wide variety of students. Delhi College was rechristened as Zakir Husain Delhi College in 1975 after being taken over by the Zakir Husain Memorial



Trust. Besides adding new disciplines in keeping with modern education, women members were also added to the faculty. The college has been a pioneer of sorts in the higher education of young women. Eighteen odd years ago, the governing body decided to admit girls, and ever since, our college has been co-educational.

In 1985, the college acquired its own present building on Jawaharlal Nehru Marg. The proximity of the college to non-elite neighbourhoods encourages parents to send their daughters to the Evening College. These young women, as they pass out, become the first generation of women from tradition-bound families, to join the formal workforce. This is a matter of great satisfaction to us.



Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening) is a premier and one of the most renowned institutions of the University of Delhi. The college is not only meticulous in applying creative pedagogical methods but it also retains the ethics and values rooted in its heritage. The teaching and non-teaching staff work in cooperation and harmony with each other to provide an amiable and

cordial atmosphere. Apart from a deep knowledge of their respective subjects, students are taught to be disciplined, benevolent, and above all, humanitarian. One of the main objectives of the college, therefore, along with imparting knowledge, is that of building its students' character.

It is centrally located, symbolically at the threshold of the old city and the new. The Premises of the College are enriched with plush lawns, trees, plants and shrubs and herbs. It has been fortunate in having a distinguished, a highly qualified, dynamic faculty that is actively involved in academic and research activities, both within the college and at the University level. Many of our teachers have been actively involved in designing pedagogy, curriculum, conducting research activities, guiding students, and conducting workshops, seminars, and conference both at national and international level. They have been members in nationally and internationally acclaimed bodies.

The college offers Honours courses in English, Hindi, History, Persian, Political Science, Sanskrit, Urdu and Commerce at UG level and Hindi, Philosophy, Political Science at PG level. The annually published College prospectus gives all relevant and updated information to admission seekers as well as their guardians. There is a methodical admission procedure as per university prescribed guidelines that ensures that admissions are conducted smoothly.



A team of able counsellors guide each student through the various stages of admission.

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Each year, the new session begins with an Orientation Program addressed by the principal of the college, outlining the guidelines, college rules and regulations and basic values along with an acknowledgement of the previous year's academic achievements. The students are introduced to faculty members who head various Committees and whom they can approach in any eventuality. ## UGCF BASED ON NEP 2020

### **CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)**

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill-based courses. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated certain guidelines.

### **OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM**

1. **Core Course:** A course which must be compulsorily studied by a candidate as a course requirement is termed as a Core course.
2. **Elective Course:** This is generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses. This may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study. It provides an extended scope or enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill.
  - 2.1. **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** An elective course offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as a Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related elective courses of an interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
  - 2.2. **Dissertation/Project:** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as a supplement study/ a support study to a project work, is called a dissertation/project. The candidate must study such a course on his/her own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member.
  - 2.3. **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure, is called a Generic Elective. A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by some other discipline/subject and vice versa. Such courses are also referred to as Generic Elective.
3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses/Foundation Courses:**

The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory



Course (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Course (SEC).

**3.1. AE Compulsory Courses (AECC):** AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These courses are mandatory for students of all disciplines. It includes Environmental Science, English/MIL Communication.

**3.2. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** Skill enhancement courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, or skills. These courses must be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

**Project/Dissertation** is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge involving / analysing /exploring a real-life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation is of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

### INTERNAL ASSESSMENT AND ATTENDANCE

The College follows the University's guidelines and regulations for internal assessment. Internal assessment carries 25% weightage and the semester examination conducted by the University carries 75% weightage.

### INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

- Attendance (Lectures including interactive periods and tutorials) 5%
- Written Assignments/Tutorials/Project Reports/Seminars 10%
- Class Test/Quiz 10%

Each paper carries a few assignments that are graded for specified marks, class tests that are again graded for specified marks, and award for attendance as per University rules.

**Attendance Rules**

There shall be 5% weightage for regularity in attending lectures and tutorials, and the credit for regularity in each paper, based on attendance, shall be as follows:

More than 67% but less than 70%	1 mark
70% or more but less than 75%	2 marks
75% or more but less than 80%	3 marks
80% or more but less than 85%	4 marks
85% and above	5 marks

[Medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks to be awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be considered for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.9. (a)(ii).]

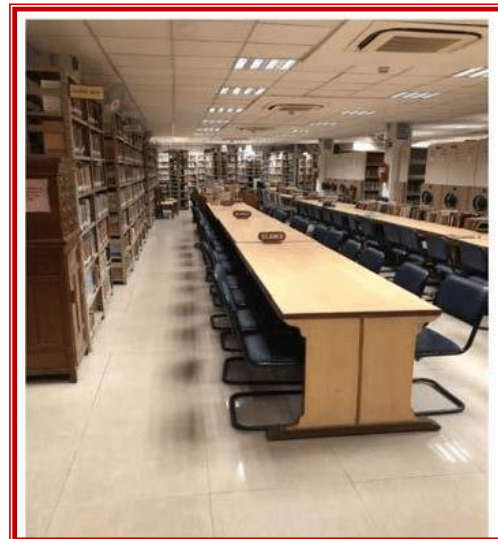

## COLLEGE FACILITIES

### Library

The College has a well-stocked library having a rich collection of approximately 90,000 books - text books, reference books and books of general interest. Some important books are also kept in the Reserve Section. The library also subscribes to journals, magazines and newspapers in several languages. The library is fully automated and provides user services through computers.



### Auditorium

Centrally air-conditioned, it seats 417 persons. It has an audio-visual system and a multi-functional lighting arrangement. It is the venue for conferences, co- curricular activities, and college functions.

### Seminar Room

The Seminar Room has state-of-the-art equipment and projection facilities. Some of the events held here include talks by distinguished speakers, conferences of the departments of the College, programmes of the various academic and cultural societies, declamations, and debates.





### **Audio Visual Room**

The Audio-Visual Room in the Science Block is equipped with facilities like public address system, overhead projector as well as LCD projector. Educational film shows, lectures and other such events are organized to give the students ample opportunities to participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

### **Computer Labs**

The College has three Computer Labs with 140 computers, in the library and elsewhere, for the use of the student community and the faculty. The computers are connected to Delhi University through WAN, helping users access e-books and e-journals.



### **Sports Facilities**

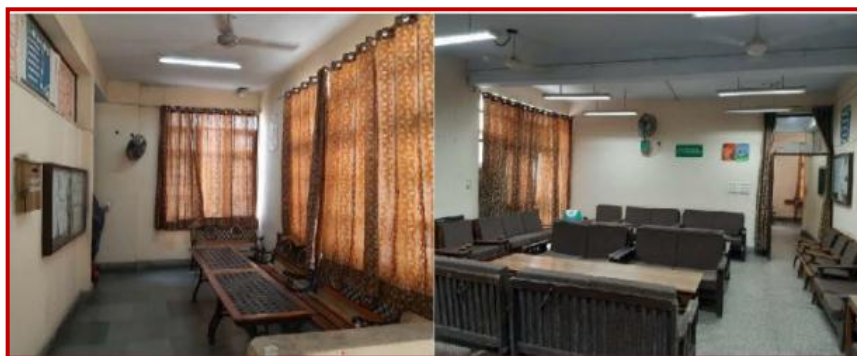

### **Boys' Common Room**

This is a place for relaxation in-between lectures. Indoor sports equipment is available for recreation.

### **Girls' Common Room**

A place for girls where they can relax and interact in private. Its lattice work enclosure has aesthetic appeal. Indoor sports facilities are also provided.





## Canteen

The college **canteen** is a students' hub, where hygienically prepared varieties of Indian meals are served. **Ours is one of the first Colleges across University of Delhi to declare its campus a 'Smoke free zone.'**



## Medical facilities

The college provides **medical facilities** for all teaching and non-teaching staff and students. Doctors are available at designated timings. Health check-up camps and blood donation camps are conducted regularly by the college NSS unit.

## Green Infrastructure

The aesthetically laid out trees, shrubs, and plants of various species, within the premises, validate the importance of greenery in our lives. Seasonal and annual flowering potted plants keep our team of gardeners busy round the year. Their labour reaps a medley of prizes for the college at the prestigious annual flower show of the University of Delhi in February, when students are given time off to watch it.





## Bank

Canara Bank operates a branch in the college which provides banking services to all.



## Photocopy- cum - Stationery Shop

The campus has a fully functional photocopy-cum-stationery shop located in the ground floor of science block. Routine stationery items on nominal

prices are available in the shop. The shop houses fully functional photocopy facility accessible to students on very nominal charges. Zakir Husain Delhi College mementos are also available from the stationery shop on order.

## Parking

Parking of scooters/bikes (not cars) is available in the earmarked parking area for bona-fide students. However, the College does not take any legal responsibility for the loss/theft of the vehicle. Safeguarding helmets is not the responsibility of the parking attendant.

## North-East Cell

A special cell is available in the College for students from the North- their well-being. It aims to prevent their racial discrimination and harassment. It is a vibrant society that organises and participates in many cultural, sports and academic activities related to students. In the year Academic Year 2022-23, students organized fresher's meet and also participated in sports activities held by NESSDU (North East Student's Society of Delhi University) in April 2023 and played football (men), Badminton Doubles, Tug of War, Volleyball, Arm Wrestling against students of different colleges. ## COLLEGE SOCIETIES

### STUDENTS' UNION

The Students' Union is a premier elected body which is responsible for coordination between the college and its students. Its membership is compulsory for all the students of the College. It cultivates the qualities of leadership, public speaking, organization, self-expression, and initiative among students. The students are encouraged to organize and participate in various seminars and presentations, providing them with a platform to enhance their abilities. Its objectives are to foster intellectual and cultural development of its members and to give them training in the methods and functioning of democratic institutions. The Union Organizes many **inter– and intra– college competitions**, which receive tremendous support from the students both within and outside the college for freshers Welcome Program. **Zeenat** is the name of the cultural program organized annually by the college students' union.

It is hugely popular for the platform it affords students to showcase their talent for anchoring, dancing, singing Street Play, Extempore, Creative writing, Treasure Hunt, etc and several other entertaining acts. The Students' Union constitute a memorial fund in the name of its former President Azeem, who passed away and award a scholarship to 2/3 needy students of the college.

### Career Counselling and Guidance Committee

The Career Counselling and Guidance Committee is intended primarily to assist students in their career planning and to provide information that might help students give an appropriate direction to their aspirations and interests. The committee provides a platform for students to pursue their professional goals with vocational guidance based on analysis of their personalities, talents, and interests. The committee regularly organises career counselling programmes such as lectures, workshops, counselling sessions etc. by people eminent in their respective fields. All students of the college are welcome for career guidance and counselling.

### Arts and Culture Society

The Arts and Culture Society of Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening) is one of its most vibrant societies of our college with students from all the different departments contributing to its vivacity and colour. The Society reaches out to all the students of the college with diverse interests and abilities in the fields of Performing Arts like Dance, Drama, Modelling and Singing. Students with exceptional abilities in the field of

Western and Indian Music (instrumental and vocal), Photography and other Creative arts are also encouraged to participate in the society activities. The college constantly creates opportunities and supports students with exceptional talents by organizing meaningful workshops and training programs for its students before staging their performances in its regular set of events. Our college has organized Arts and Culture events in the past in collaboration with prestigious institutions like the National School of Drama, Sangeet Natak Academy, Delhi and Urdu Academy, Delhi. Many of our students have won accolades, awards, and honors at the national level especially in the field of Drama and Vocal Music. Members of the Faculty work together with student office bearers to make the best of the human and material resources. For staging all major events the college has a huge auditorium with state-of-the-art facilities.

The Arts and Culture Society of Zakir Husain Delhi College, Evening, begins its year with *Jashn-e-Aaghaz* (The festival of initiation) in which the society introduces and stages the talents of fresh students inducted in the new academic session. The introductory program is followed by programs like *Navrang* (a colourful event of performances, inter-college competitions of Song, Dance and Modelling) and *ZakDram* (a dedicated inter-college drama festival) staged by the three years together. ## **ACADEMIC SOCIETIES**

There are 14 departments and each has its own Academic Society. These organize national conferences, seminars, debates, musical soirees, talks, field trips, and other related co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

### **Sifer: The Society of the Department of Mathematics**

The Department has its Mathematics' Society which conducts the annual Mathematics fest under the banner of "Sifer". The mathematics fest organizes seminars, workshops, Mathematical games, quizzes, Sudoku etc.

### **Sarmaya: The Society of the Department of Commerce**

It is one of the oldest and most functional society and is growing at an expeditious rate. The society helps the students to avail ample opportunities to widen their horizons and quench their curiosity apart from helping them sharpen their skills. "SARMAYA" has organized several events, seminars, activities, and academic visit throughout the year. As a community we understand the importance support plays in any organization and try to maintain good association in the corporate world.

Every academic year the society organizes various events starting from "Freshers Welcome," a welcome to first year students to the department giving them an opportunity to showcase their talents and get familiar with the department all the way. Every year the members of the society organize a programme on 5<sup>th</sup> September to acknowledge the efforts put in by the teachers for the development of the students. A fun round for all the teachers is organized wherein the teachers are asked some fun questions by the students. Video messages by the former students of the college wishing the teachers and their roles in life are also generally shown.

## Adventure Program

The camps are held every year which are attended by approximately 1500 NSS volunteers with at least 50% of the volunteers being girl students. These camps are conducted in Himalayan Region in the North and Arunachal Pradesh in North East region. The adventure activities undertaken in these camps includes trekking of mountains, water rafting, Para-sailing and basic skiing.

## NSS Republic Day Parade Camp:

The first Republic Day Camp of NSS Volunteers was held in 1988. The camp takes place in Delhi between 1st and 31st January every year with 200 NSS selected volunteers who are good in discipline, March-past, and cultural activities.

## Sports

## **Gandhi Study Centre**

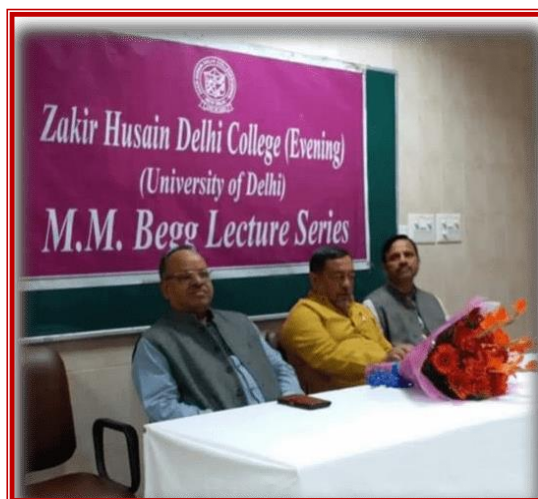

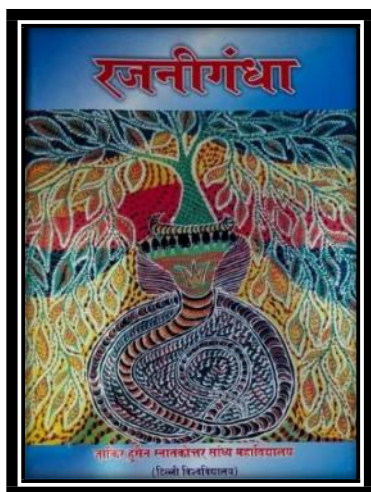


University, West Bengal, has also elated the dignity of this prestigious lecture series by his inspiring and highly informative speech.

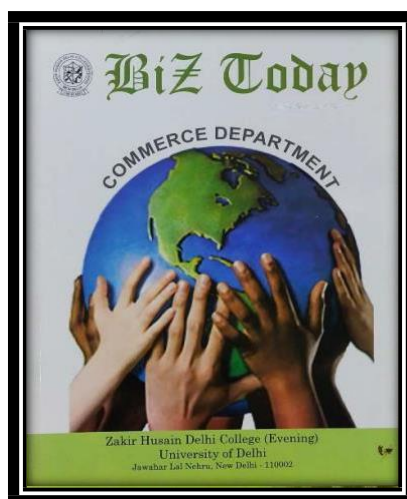
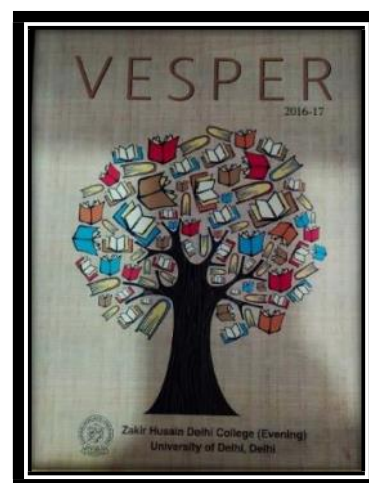
## COLLEGE MAGAZINES

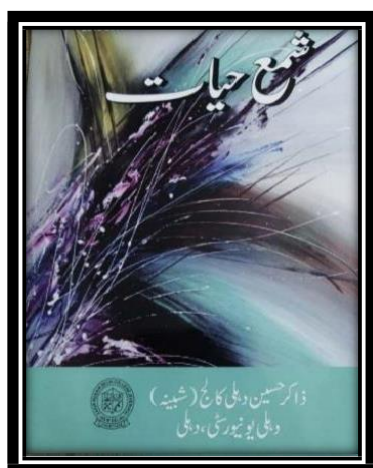

5. Aadhaar Enrolment ID and Scanned copy of Bank passbook
6. If Institute/School is different from domicile state of the applicant, then Bona fide student certificate from Institute / School.

## **Right to Information Act 2005 – Statutory Information**

The basic details as per 4(B) of the Act are given below:

1. **Management of the College:** Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening) is governed by the Managing Committee of the College known as the Governing Body. The Governing Body is constituted by the MHRD. The day-to-day management is looked after by the various sub-committees constituted by the Staff Council of the College. All the teachers of the College are members of the Staff Council. The Staff Council is operated through the Secretary of the Staff Council. The responsibility of supervision also lies with the different committees constituted by the Staff Council such as the Admission Committee which takes decisions regarding the admission policy of the College as formulated from year to year. The Proctorial Board looks after discipline. Other committees such as the Sports Committee, Time- Table Committee, Enabling Unit, Development Fund Committee, and Statutory Provident Fund Committee play their defined roles. The Academic Supervisory Committee looks after the implementation of the Time-table and deals with other academic issues such as Internal Assessment. There is another committee known as the Internal Complaints Committee.
2. The College follows rules and regulations as formulated by the competent authorities of the University of Delhi and the University Grants Commission (UGC). As explained above, some of the decisions are taken by the Staff Council and these are implemented through the sub-committees constituted by the Staff Council. The Bursar looks after the financial matters and handles them along with the Honorary Treasurer of the College.
3. The College maintains its past and present records by itself. The College Administration, Staff and other employees take guidance from various manuals issued by the University of Delhi and the UGC, for example, Governance of Colleges and the University Calendar. A Public Information Officer has been appointed to provide statutory information on behalf of the College. He is available to the public between 4.00 and 9.00 p.m. The college reveals relevant details and cooperates with anyone seeking information under the RTI Act.

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper, to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
  - a) Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/ Department and against any student within the University of Delhi;
  - b) Carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapons;
  - c) Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976;
  - d) Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
  - e) Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women;
  - f) Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner;
  - g) Wilful destruction of institutional property;
  - h) Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds;
  - i) Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
  - j) Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice- Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students-.
  - a) Be expelled; or
  - b) Be, for a stated period rusticated; or
  - c) Be not for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
  - d) Be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
  - e) Be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or
  - f) That the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.

5. The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education and Librarian shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments, in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.

6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules.

7. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice Chancellor and the several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the Rules that have been framed there under by the University.

## **ORDINANCE XV-C**

### **Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging**

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College / Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.

2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.

3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which

a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.



- b. Violate the status, dignity, and honour of women students.
- c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
- d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt
- e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behaviour.

4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate information of the occurrence of ragging.

5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo-moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.

6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.

7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/ she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.

8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry his / her decision shall be final.

9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c), the Vice Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.

10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination, for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared, be cancelled.

11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of Delhi University are found guilty, under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.

12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement to ragging, will also amount to ragging.

13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/ directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid / assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

**Note: Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C:**

Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the students(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India. They will also be rendered ineligible for seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi for a period of five years. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

**ORDINANCE XV-D**

**The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)**

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at the workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at the workplace. For details, please see the website <http://indiacode.nic.in/acts-in-pdf/142013.pdf>.
