- The college was renamed as **Zakir Husain Delhi College (Evening)** in 2013.

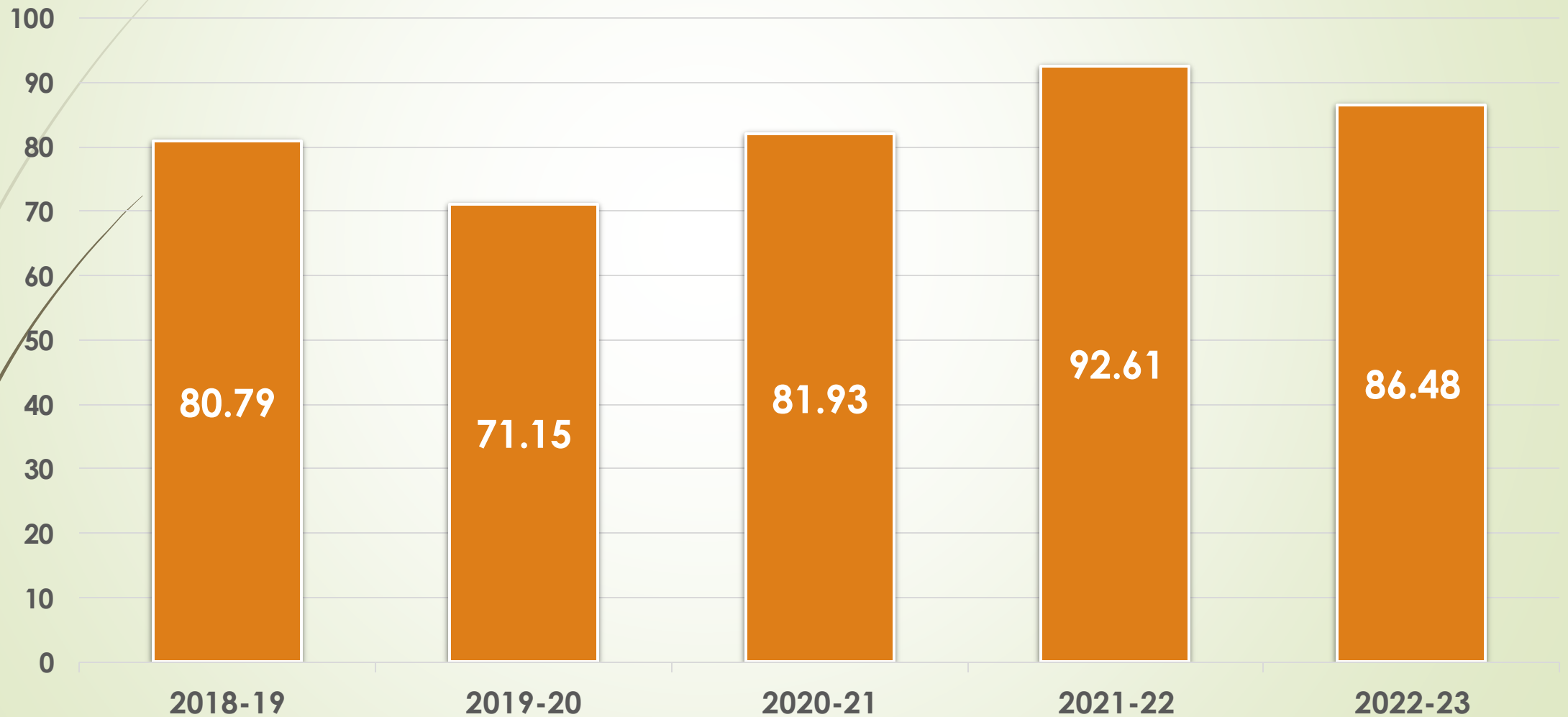

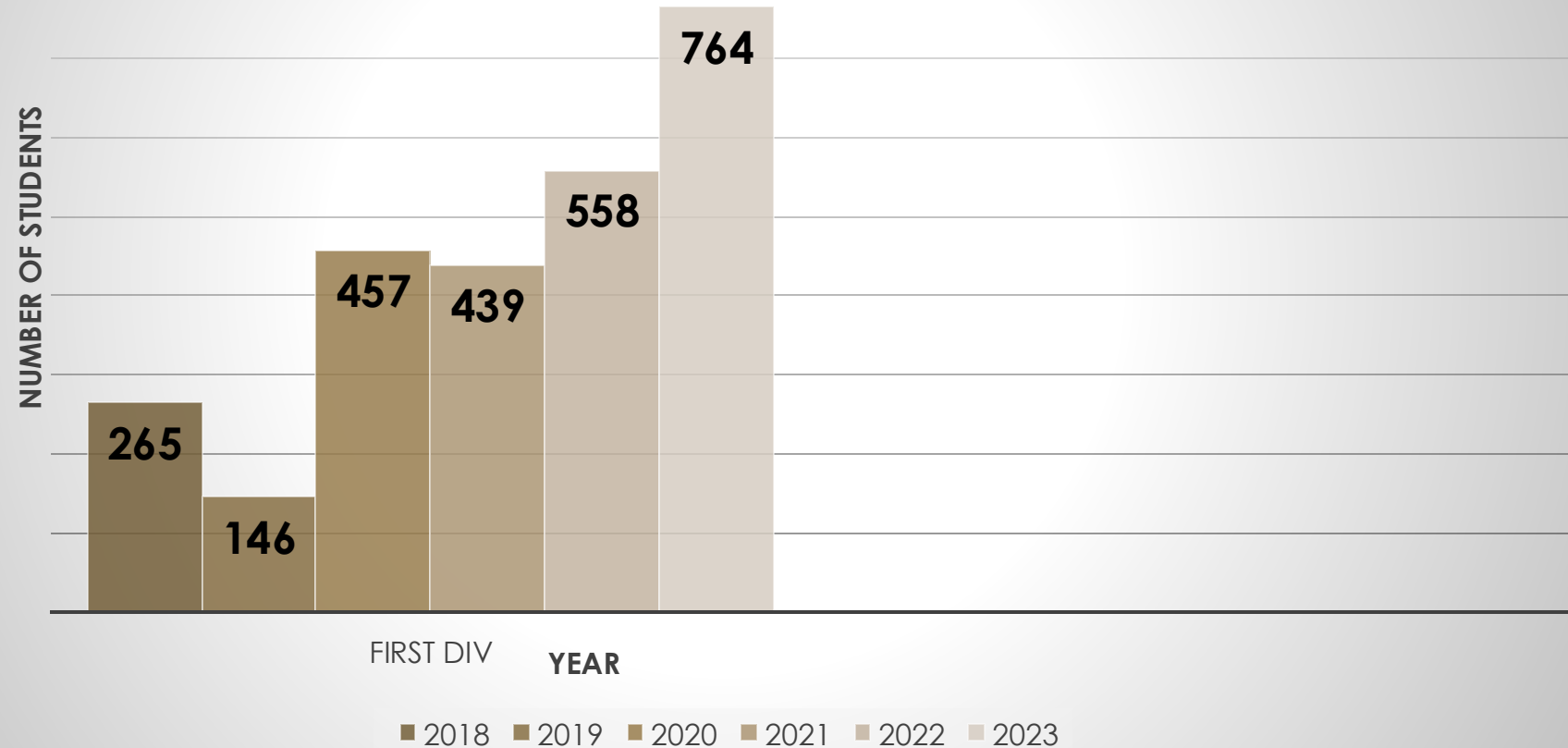
OVERALL PASS PERCENTAGE

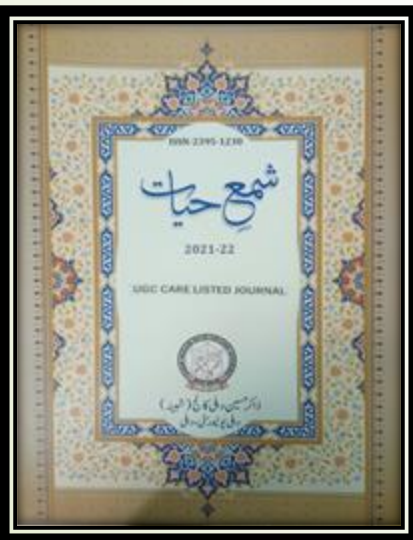

LIBRARY



LIBRARY

- One of the oldest among the libraries in the University of Delhi.
- Technologically modern, well-stocked, well-equipped, user-friendly, and spread over 345 square meters.
- Seating capacity of 145 persons with two fully air-conditioned reading halls and one faculty reading room with a seating capacity of 25.
- The Library has a collection of 63,367 books on diverse subjects. It also houses 223 rare books in Arabic, Persian and Urdu.
- The library subscribes to 23 magazines and journals in English, Hindi, and other Indian languages, as well as 11 newspapers.
- Users can access many e-resources on various subjects available on the **Delhi University Library System (DULS) Portal**.

- **Previous Year Question Papers (PYQP)** of examinations of various courses are available in the reference section for consultation by students.
- There is a **dedicated IKS section**.
- There is a dedicated section of books on Delhi.
- **Separate room for visually impaired students** and faculty members with the following facilities: **Advanced level Computer with NVDA Screen reading software, KIBO Scanner, Printer and EVO-10 Recorder.**
- Membership in the **Delhi University Braille Library** is also provided for visually impaired persons to access all reading material in Braille and audio format.

INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM

- The College aims to revitalize and promote indigenous knowledge. IKS is a pioneering platform for interdisciplinary research, preservation and dissemination of India's rich cultural and traditional knowledge.
- Under the NEP, various departments in the College offer courses tailored to the goals of the Indian Knowledge System.
- There is a separate IKS section in the college library.

ORDINANCE XV – C Prohibition of and punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of the Delhi University System as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging, for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of a senior student is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in anyway considered junior or inferior by other students.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

- **ALL INDIA ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP:** The University of Delhi conducts a competitive examination in October every year for award of scholarship or Rs.250.00 per month for a period of three years. Students of 1st year Honours Courses may appear for this examination. They may contact the examination branch VII of University of Delhi between 10 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. on a working day after August.
- **2. NIDHI DEVGAN AWARD:** The College will award a sum of Rs.2000/- to the Best student of B.A. (Hons.) English IIIrd year (Securing highest marks in all three years put together) in memory of Late Ms. Nidhi Devgan, who was a lecturer in the department of English of this College.
- **3. WAKF COUNCIL:** Central Wakf Council offers a limited number of scholarship and ad-hoc grants to meritorious students of lower income groups.
- **4. H.H.ZUBERI AID FUND & R. VENKATESAN AID FUND:** Financial Assistance is available to the needy/ deserving students at the time of admission.
- **5. SHYAMA SAXENA AWARD:** Rs.1000/- is given to the student of IIInd year class who obtains highest marks in Sanskrit (but not less than 60%) in his/her Ist year class.
- **6. ARUNABH BORGOHAIN MEMORIAL AWARD:** Rs.3000/- is awarded by the College to the topper of B.A. (Hons) English in the Ist year and IIInd year respectively. (both semesters combined)

ANNUAL CONVOCATION

Zakir Husain Delhi College Evening is one of the few Delhi University Colleges where Convocation is held. It was Started in 2017.

The 4th Convocation was held on 1st September, 2023.

Convocation for 2023-24 is scheduled to be held soon.



ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT

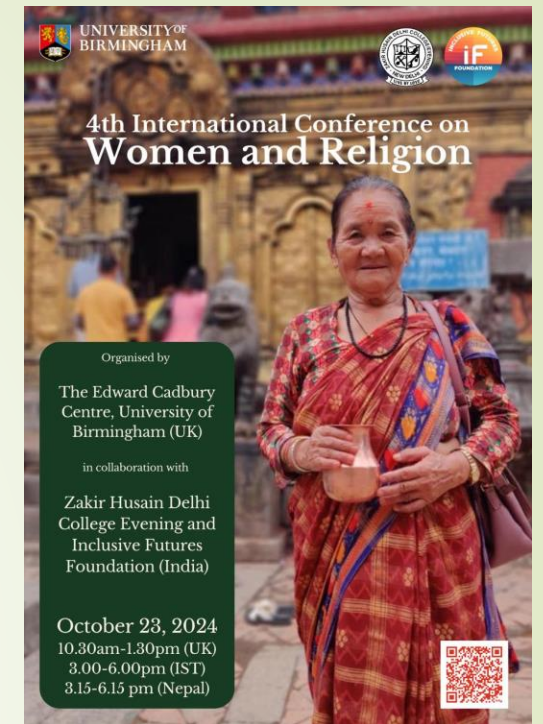

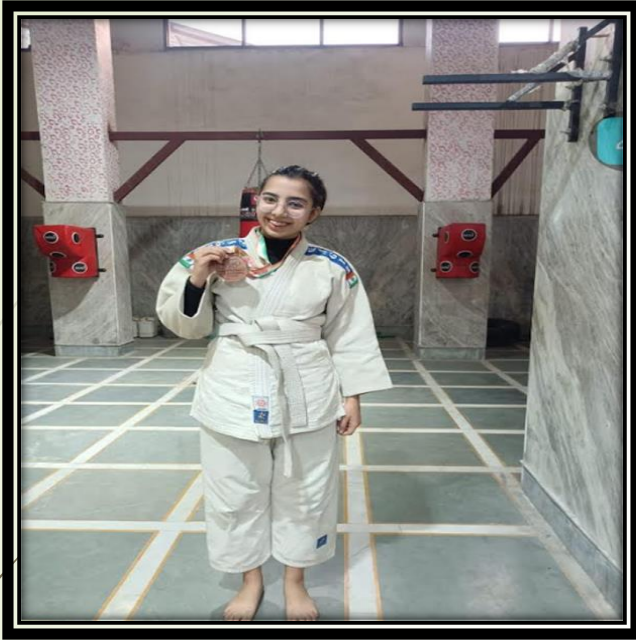

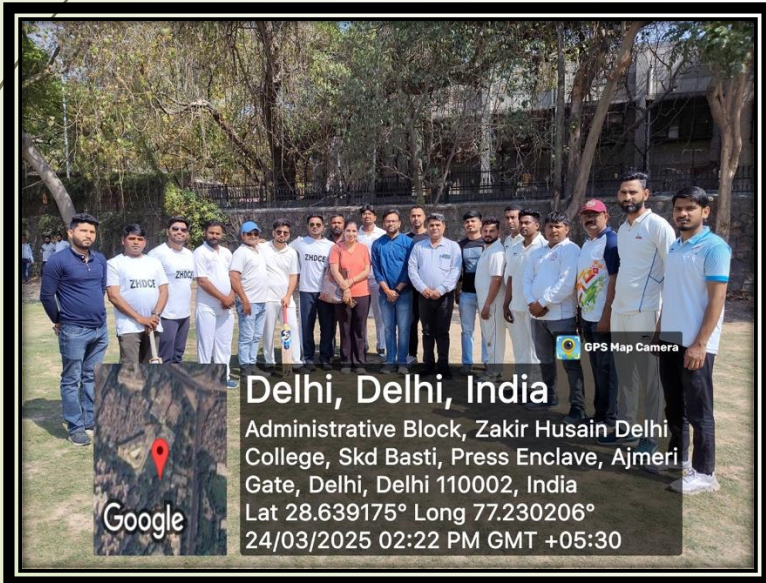
